Over the past several years we have been able to secure funds and assist with over 100 vouchers to help people provide care for their pets.

We are attempting to reduce costs to the community for animal control, disease control and for the euthanizing of unwanted strays as we strive to make life better for area pets and their owners.

C.A.R.E.S. currently has multiple ongoing programs to assist pets and their owners in our area, Fetch.

#### Spay/Neuter Program

Issue: Overpopulation of animals leaves many homeless and without proper care.

C.A.R.E.S. provides \$50 vouchers to offset the cost of having a pet spayed or neutered. This way there are fewer litters of kittens and puppies that can't find homes.

#### Senior Veterinary Care Program

Issue: Seniors often enjoy the company of a pet, but may have trouble affording proper veterinary care for their pets.

C.A.R.E.S. provides \$50 vouchers to offset the cost of veterinary care or services to help their pets with a wide range of issues.

# It's raining CATS & DOGS

The worst thing about animals living and roaming unckeched is the rapid increase in stray populations. This causes problems not only for the animals, but also for the people living in the same areas as well.

Every year **8-to-10 MILLION** cats and dogs are homeless. Of that number, **4-to-5 MILLION** are euthanized, while the rest struggle to live outdoors in poor conditions and weather.

An unspayed female cat, her mate and all of their offspring producing just 2 litters per year with 2.8 survivors per litter can total:

12 1 year
67 2 years
376 3 years
2,107 4 years
11,801 5 years
66,088 6 years
370,092 7 years
2,072,514 8 years
11,606,077 9 years

An unspayed female dog, her mate and all of their puppies' puppies, if none of them are spayed or neutered can add up to:

16 1 year 128 2 years 512 3 years 2,048 4 years 12,288 5 years 67,000 6 years



That's a LOT of homeless, uncared-for animals.

This is why C.A.R.E.S. exists. We want each animal in our community to be happily cared for in a home.
